Funding History

March 2021

• American Rescue Plan Act (ARP) was enacted

July 2021

 Indiana Borough received \$689,000 in State and Local Fiscal Recovery Act (SLFRF) funding

November 2021

 Borough Council approved a donation of \$40,000 to Citizens' Ambulance Service using SLFRF funds

July 2022

 Indiana Borough is expecting to receive \$689,000 in additional SLFRF funding Funds must be obligated by:

December 31, 2024

Funds must be spent by:

December 31, 2026



State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds Overview

ARP created the SLFRF program to deliver \$350 billion in fiscal aid to state, local and Tribal governments

The key objectives for SLFRF are to:

- Fight the pandemic and support struggling families and businesses
- Maintain vital public services, even amid revenue declines
- Build a strong, resilient and equitable recovery

Funding from the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds is subject to the **Final Rule**:

- Treasury designed the Final Rule with the smallest recipients in mind
- Treasury released the Final Rule on January 6, 2022
- The Final Rule took effect on April 1, 2022

Four Key Eligible Use Categories

ARP provides four major categories of eligible uses to tackle the broad range of public health and economic challenges caused or exacerbated by the COVID-19 emergency.

Public Sector Revenues

Providing government services up to the amount of revenue loss due to the pandemic

Public Health & Economic Response

Responding to COVID-19's public health impact, along with its economic harms

Premium Pay for Essential Workers

Offering additional support to workers who bear the greatest health risks because of their service in critical sectors

Water, Sewer & Broadband Infrastructure

Providing funding to critical water and sewer projects, along with high-speed broadband infrastructure

Spending on Government Services


Recipients may elect to use a "standard allowance" of up to \$10 million to spend on government services these funds to provide government services through the life of the program, which greatly simplifies the program for small localities

Government services generally include any service traditionally provided by a government unless Treasury has stated otherwise, such as:

- Construction of schools and hospitals
- Road building and maintenance, and other infrastructure
- Health and other services
- General government administration, staff, and administrative facilities
- Environmental remediation
- Provision of police, fire, and other public safety services (including purchase of fire trucks and police vehicles)

Government services is the most flexible eligible use category under the SLFRF program and funds are subject to streamlined reporting and compliance requirements


Orange - Outside Borough


"How do you feel Indiana Borough should allocate ARP funds?"




